



- APD patrol assignments and funding is primarily based on 911 call volume.
- O Do not hesitate to call 911 for non-emergent concern. 911 operator will prioritize calls.
- Noise complaints must be investigated by APD prior to Atlanta District 2 Council or MNA LPC involvement.

JOIN MNA

- MNA Safety Patrol Program is 100% funded by MNA membership
- More members = more patrols. It is that simple.

PARTICIPATE IN COURTWATCH

- Follow offenders through the justice system
- Complete a Community Impact Statement for review by presiding judge
- Be present at hearings to make a statement about the dangers of repeat offenders

"DID YOU KNOW?" CLEAN UP EDUCATION CAMPAIGN

MNA Infrastructure Committee will be sending a focused mailer to the Garden District as part of a new education campaign related to trash and pet waste handling to encourage residents to be thoughtful caretakers of our community.

If you live in the Garden District or the MID and are struggling with your property manager's handling of waste issues, please contact us at infrastructure@midtownatlanta.org.

The City of Atlanta has codes related to trash can storage, bulk waste and pet waste. Not adhering to these ordinances can result in warnings or citations and fines.



HERBIE CURBIE MANAGEMENT

Herbie Curbies (trash cans) should be placed in the right-of-way for Monday AM pick up no earlier than the day before collection (Sunday).

Cans should be stored preferably behind the front plane of the house or hidden behind a gate no later than 7 PM on collection day (Monday).

We are currently working on solutions for the few properties who do not have reasonable access to move their cans. All others should make every effort to comply. Failure to comply with Herbie Curbie policy could result in warnings and/or citations from City of Atlanta Waste Management.

Per the City of Atlanta website, backyard pick-up service is available to residents over the age of 70 or residents with physical limitations at no cost. Backyard pick-up service for people who do not qualify for it at no cost can be arranged for an estimated annual fee of \$925.00. Please visit the City of Atlanta Waste Management site for contact details.



BULK WASTE

Midtown's bulk collection is the first FULL week of the month starting on a Monday.

Bulk waste should NOT be placed at the curb any earlier than the Sunday before the pick-up week.

Up to one room of furniture and NO CONSTRUCTION WASTE may be placed at the curb for pick up. Tires are not accepted.



PET WASTE

Please pick up after your pet and be a courteous neighbor.

Pet waste bags can NOT be placed in yard waste bags. Waste Management will remove them from the bag and leave them roadside.

Place them in a regular trash can. It is best to take home your pet's waste bags and place it in your own cans.

Pet waste bags will not mulch with the yard trimmings.



AMIR FAROKHI'S LET'S FIX IT 2GETHER INITIATIVE

Our councilman, Amir Farokhi, initiated an effort to address small issues that add up to significant frustration in communities in District 2. Pot holes, sidewalk repairs, pedestrian signal timing, waste management issues, etc.

Councilman Farokhi has walked the Midtown Garden District already with the MNA Infrastructure Team and will be walking it again on 10/19.

MNA thanks Councilman Farokhi for understanding that paying attention to the small details is important.




